
Warning! This is a *very long walk* and you should not try it unless you are physically fit and have back-up support.

There are just a few patches with nettles that might be uncomfortable for bare legs. Good boots are advisable because of the distance. Although it is perfectly walkable in winter, this walk is much better undertaken in dry conditions because the drag of damp earth on the feet can be very tiring. Any sensible clothing should be fine, depending on the season. Because of the distance, this monster walk is not suitable for your pet.



The walk begins in **Walliswood, Surrey, postcode RH5 5RD**, opposite the *Scarlett Arms* where there is a public car park.

The Walk

Part 1

This is the **Cranleigh to the Church in the Woods** walk, from the start of **Leg 3** in Walliswood to the **end** of the text, going back to the **start** of the text and ending after **Leg 1** section **2**.

Part 2

This is the **Rudgwick, the Canal and a Watermill** walk beginning with **Leg 3** section **11** to the **end** of the text, going back to the **start** of the text and finishing at the end of **Leg 2**.

Part 3

This is **Leg 2** of the **Cranleigh to the Church in the Woods** walk, Rudgwick to Walliswood.

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
